## Lawn Sprinkler Systems

According to City policy, homeowners are required to keep backflow prevention devices in good, working condition. Test reports must be filed every two years, on even numbered years. The device is also required to be rebuilt or replaced upon failure of the backflow testing.



**Test reports need to be completed and submitted by June 1st, 2024, by a certified technician, licensed with the City of Bel Aire.** You can find a list of companies who perform this work at [www.belaireks.gov/LicensedContractors](http://www.belaireks.gov/LicensedContractors) under the Plumbing/Sprinkler tab.

## Winter Average Consumption

Sewer rates are calculated every year based on your average winter water usage, known as Winter Average Consumption (WAC). Usage during December, January, and February, which is billed the following month (January, February, and March), will be used for this calculation. This WAC will be used from April to March of the following year when WAC is recalculated.

***Any water leak repairs made during this time should be reported to the Utility Department.***

$$WAC = \frac{DEC + JAN + FEB}{3}$$
